Iduapriem Mine Advances Women Empowerment with 'Lead Her Forward' Conference

In his keynote address, the Managing Director, Daniel Boadi underscored that empowering young girls is both a social responsibility and a strategic investment in the future. He reaffirmed the Mine's purpose of mining to empower people and advance societies, highlighting ongoing efforts to promote inclusion, nurture talent, and create opportunities for women to thrive and lead. A key highlight of the conference was a panel discussion moderated by Senior Nursing Officer, Habeebi J. Opoku Ansah. The session featured distinguished speakers including Director of Human Resources at Iduapriem Mine, Adinorta Nti Yeboah; Assistant Registrar and Counsellor at UMaT, Peace Sitsofe Kploanyi and Municipal Girl Child Education Coordinator, Gifty Efua Nyinaku.

The panel explored critical themes aligned with the conference's "Give to Gain" focus. Discussions addressed the realities women face in leadership, including systemic barriers, workplace bias, cultural expectations, and self-doubt, while emphasizing resilience, continuous learning, and strong support systems. The importance of mentorship as a tool for empowerment and growth was also highlighted, with speakers encouraging participants to both seek guidance and commit to uplifting others. Additionally, the conversation examined the impact of peer pressure on young girls, stressing the need for positive influences, self-awareness, and strong values in shaping future success.

Adding a personal and inspiring perspective, Nhyiraba Ama Lamptey, an Iduapriem Mine employee from the host community who is now a Plant Operator, shared her journey and encouraged young girls and future leaders to remain determined, embrace opportunities for growth, and use their life experiences as a foundation for success. The conference also featured remarks from the Queen Mother of Esuaso Divisional Stool, Nana Ekuia Bimah II, Queen Mother of Apinto Divisional Stool, Nana Abena Boaduwa II as well as the Paramount Queen Mother of Wassa Fiase, Nana Abena Kunadjoa II who collectively encouraged young women to pursue education, uphold strong values, and embrace leadership opportunities within their communities.
