On Wednesday, 25 March 2026, AngloGold Ashanti Iduapriem Mine undertook a comprehensive Health Screening and Health Talk as part of its quarterly periodic medical outreach schedule. The medical outreach programme was also used to support and sponsor the maiden edition of the Tarkwa Nsuaem Expo 2026, themed “Uniting the People through Culture and Creativity for Development.”

A multidisciplinary team of doctors, nurses, dentists, optometrists, pharmacists, and laboratory technicians provided a wide range of free health services, including general consultations, laboratory tests, dental care, drug dispensing, HIV counselling and testing, as well as eye, ear, nose, and throat screenings. The outreach offered over 430 residents an invaluable opportunity to monitor their health at no cost, reinforcing the Mine’s mission to promote community wellness.

Addressing participants during the outreach, Manager – Health Services, Dr. Kwesi G. Annor, emphasized the Mine’s commitment to ensuring the health and safety of community residents. He noted that initiatives like this are part of the Mine’s broader strategy to support sustainable community development and well-being.

In a motivational health talk, Superintendent- Occupational Health, Cynthia Odoom-Wilson, encouraged participants to take proactive steps towards maintaining good health. She underscored the importance of regular check-ups, adopting healthy lifestyles, and taking advantage of opportunities like the health outreach to foster a stronger, healthier community.
